Junior High

The Junior High School Winter Rally at Ontario Christian Assembly is a retreat for Junior High School Age youth. There are many activities, including sledding, snowboarding, music, crafts, Bible talks, and other events. The programme is sponsored by the Christian Churches of Ontario. There are usually 30-50 youth participating. ***Please note that the Junior High and Senior High will attend on separate dates.***

The weekend begins on Friday night and ends Sunday afternoon. There is a lot of free time and outdoor time available to the participants, but each participant is expect to participate in all the scheduled activities.

Here's some things to bring: Sleeping bag, change of clothes (several—it gets pretty wet in the snow), snowboards or sleds, cross-country skis (the hills are not steep enough for downhill skis), and skates. Please do not bring lots of cash, since there is nothing to spend it on at the camp. You will be staying in heated cabins of 15-20 campers. If you have a musical instrument, bring that too if you wish.

The camp is located North of Orangeville, along the Bruce trail. Take Highway 10 North from Orangeville until you come to a "T" end, which is Highway 89. Turn East onto 89, away from Shelburne, and go up the first hill. At the top of the hill you will see a sign for "Hurontario Street," which is a gravel road. Turn right onto the road, then left at the gate into the camp. Follow the camp road down the hill to the camp site.
